Organization Note:

The collection has been maintained in its original order and Ross' original file numbers have been maintained.

Biographical Note:

Ann Holohan Ross (1932-2004) was a lifelong resident of Schenectady and was interested in local history and genealogy. She was the daughter of Pierce and Alice (Cody) Holohan. She graduated from Nazareth College in 1954 with a degree in art history. Soon after, she married John R. Ross. The couple had four daughters. Ross briefly taught art at Nott Terrace High School, then became a substitute teacher.

In her work with the Schenectady County Historical Society (where she served on the board of trustees), the Capital District Genealogical Society, New York State Genealogical Volunteers, and the Mormon Library, Ross helped researchers in tracing their ancestry and helped to promote local history. In addition to her work in genealogical and historical research, Ross was also a communicant of St. John the Evangelist Church in Schenectady and was active in church committees there. She was also active in the Girl Scouts, receiving a Volunteer of the Year Award from the organization.

Ross died on November 12, 2004 at her home on Glenwood Boulevard in Schenectady. She is buried at Most Holy Redeemer Cemetery in Niskayuna.
