SECOND. The objects for which the said corporation is
formed are:

known as Schenectady County
3. To gather books, manuscripts, papers and relics
relating to the early history of Schenectady
County and contiguous territory.
4. To suitably mark places of historic interest.
5. To acquire by purchase, gift, devise, or otherwise,
the title to, or the custody and control of histor-
ic spots and places.

THIRD. The principal office of the said corporation is
to be located in the City of Schenectady, in the
County of Schenectady, State of New York.

FOURTH. The territory in which the operations of said
corporation are to be principally conducted, is
the County of Schenectady

FIFTH. The number of directors of said corporation, who
shall be known as the Board of Trustees, is
twenty-five (25), nine of whom shall constitute a
quorum for the transaction of business.
